3) BLOGS

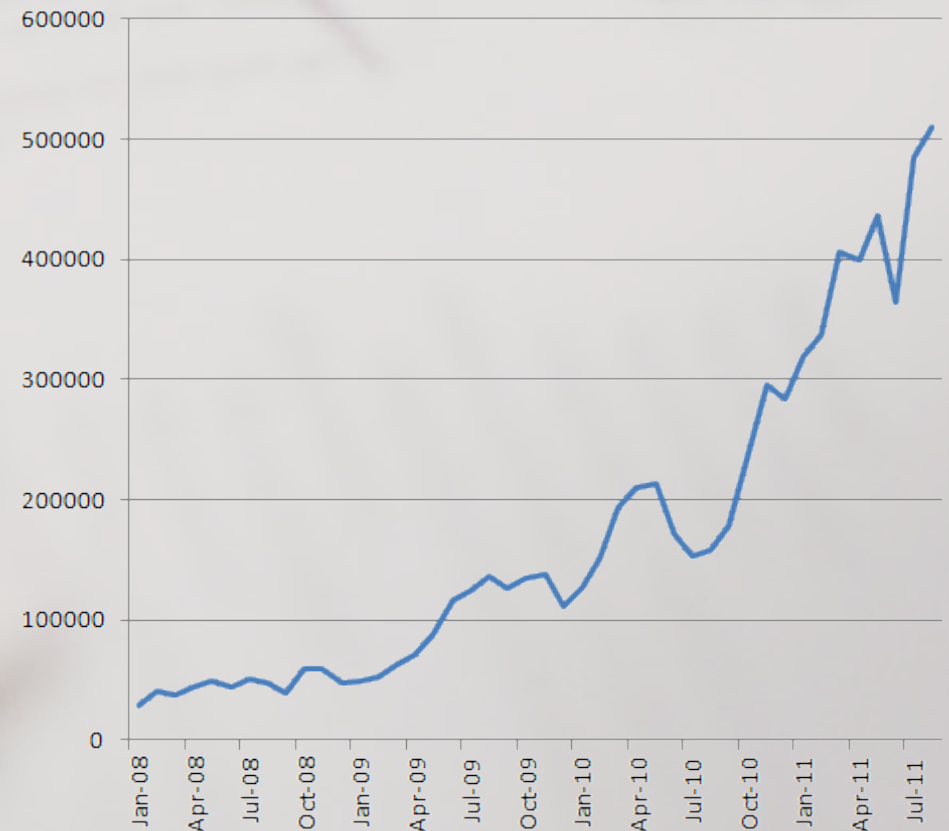
e-IR's blogs offer a flexible publishing space that facilitates discussion on key issues between academics and students - without the barriers posed by more formal settings.
